July's Wise Women Read Choice: Hour of the Witch

KWN's Wise Women Read Book Discussion Group is at 6:30 p.m. on July 12 at Blue House Books, 5915 6th Ave. A, Kenosha, and we'll be discussing *Hour of the Witch* by Chris Bohjalian. From the independent bookstore Tattered Cover in Denver, CO, Lisa Casper describes the book this way: "Trapped in a marriage with a violent man in Puritan New England, the fierce and resilient Mary Deerfield has the audacity to file for divorce in a time when women are accused of witchcraft for any non-conforming behavior. While historical, this story rings true for today."

And don't forget to mark your calendar for the meeting on August 9 when we'll be discussing *Verity* by Colleen Hoover. Buzzfeed describes it this way: "The energy and pace in this book are like a fun house at a carnival. It's ever-changing, and just when you think you know what to expect next, Hoover hits you with another turn. Up until the very final page, readers are mining for clues. Just when you thought you figured out the who, what, when, where, and why, it completely changes, leaving you gobsmacked."

Have you seen Kenosha's newest piece of public art?

Kenosha has a place in rock and roll history, and now there is a new piece of sculpture to commemorate it! The interactive sculpture is located at 58th Street and 2nd Avenue, on the boulevard entering Southport Marina. The Winter Dance Party sculpture was unveiled on Tuesday, June 21st, to commemorate the stars of the Winter Dance Party tour, who performed in Kenosha on January 24th, 1959 on the second stop of their tour. The tour ended tragically on February 3rd, when Buddy Holly, Richie Valens and J.P. "The Big Bopper" Richardson were all killed in a plane crash in Clear Lake, Iowa. This crash was memorialized in Don McLean's 1971 hit, American Pie, as "The Day the Music Died".

KWN Member, Guida Brown, her husband, David Mcgrath and the one remaining star of that tour, Dion DiMucci (of Dion and the Belmonts), worked tirelessly to see that Kenosha got this sculpture. It is situated close to the Eagles Club, now Marina Shores, where the concert took place.



The sculpture incorporates elements of all three artists and was designed by local sculptor, Martin Antaramian.
