#### Wise Women Read is Back!

Join KWN's Women Who Read to discuss *Deacon King Kong* by James McBride, author of the National Book Award winning *The Good Lord Bird* and the beloved memoir *The Color of Water*. This, his newest book, is a "propulsive and comic neighborhood epic set in the 1960s with a cast of characters that are beguiling, boozed-filled, and larger than life. When a young drug lord is shot in broad daylight by a bumbling drunk known to everyone as Sportcoat, the Brooklyn neighborhood they live in is upended. As Sportcoat comically and unknowingly dodges the police, his actions ricochet around him, igniting a web of drug wars, backdoor dealings with mobsters, and church brawls that demonstrate just how vital yet fragile communities can be. *Deacon King Kong* tells the fictional story of one Brooklyn project but in so doing tells a broader story of race and religion, getting by and getting out, and how grudges and alliances become embedded in the foundations of our neighborhoods.
