# Hello, KWN,

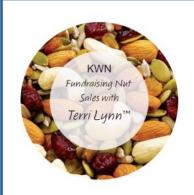

#### September's Wise Women Read Meeting

On **Tuesday, September 12**, at 6:30 p.m. at Blue House Books, 5915 6th Ave A, we'll be discussing *The Dictionary of Lost Words* by Pip Williams. From *Bookshop.org*: "Set during the height of the women's suffrage movement and with the Great War looming, *The Dictionary of Lost Words* reveals a lost narrative, hidden between the lines of a history written by men.

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Inspired by actual events, author Pip Williams has delved into the archives of the Oxford English Dictionary to tell this highly original story. The Dictionary of Lost Words is a delightful, lyrical, and deeply thought-provoking celebration of words and the power of language to shape the world."

And, on **Tuesday**, **October 10**, just in time for Halloween, we're reading Catriona Ward's *The Last House on Needless Street*. Named one of the "50 Best Horror Books of All Time" by *Esquire*, here's what the back of the book says:

"In a boarded-up house on a dead-end street at the edge of the wild Washington woods lives a family of three.

"A young girl who isn't allowed outside, not after last time.

"A man who drinks alone in front of his TV, trying to ignore the gaps in his memory.

"And a house cat who loves napping and reading the Bible. "An unspeakable secret binds them together, but when a new neighbor moves in next door, what is buried out among the birch trees may come back to haunt them all.

"The Last House on Needless Street is an immersive and shocking journey that will keep you guessing until the last page."
